

## Road Closures for Construction of the Harbor Point Connector Bridge

Closures expected to begin on January 5<sup>th</sup>, 2017

The Baltimore City Department of Transportation would like to advise motorists that portions of Lancaster Street, Central Avenue, and Aliceanna Street will soon close for construction of the Harbor Point Connector Bridge. Full project details and regular updates are available at <u>CentralAveProject.com</u>.

Starting on or around January 5<sup>th</sup>, 2017, <u>Central Avenue will close between Lancaster Street and Aliceanna Street</u> and <u>Lancaster Street will close between S. Exeter Street and S. Eden Street</u>. **The businesses in the 1000 block of Lancaster Street will remain open and accessible from the S. Exeter Street side of the block.** A portion of the 1000 block of Lancaster Street and the entire sidewalk will remain open for access to the businesses in the block. Please note the Promenade will be closed to pedestrian and bicycle traffic between S. Exeter Street and S. Eden Street.

Adrienne Barnes Kathy Dominick 410-361-9296 The closures will go into effect for materials and equipment to be brought into the area; construction will begin on or around January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2017. The closures will remain in effect for approximately one year while construction is completed.

As the project advances <u>Aliceanna Street between Central Avenue and Eden Street will be reduced to one</u> <u>westbound lane</u>. There will be no eastbound traffic on Aliceanna Street between Central Avenue and Eden Street. An additional Traffic Advisory with detailed information will be released as the date of the lane reduction is confirmed.

Motorists traveling in this vicinity are encouraged to plan ahead and allow additional travel time. Directional signage will be posted to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists through the area.
